

## ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

### Sec. 12-1. Adoption of state law.

There is hereby adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if set out in full those provisions of state law known as the uniform traffic act as contained in S.C. Code 1976, § 56-5-10 et seq.

### Sec. 12-2. Obedience to traffic control devices and traffic officers.

(a) Drivers of all vehicles shall abide by signals of traffic officers and all automatic and stationary traffic signs and signals within the city limits.

(b) No person shall willfully fail or refuse to comply with any lawful order or direction of any police officer or other city employee authorized to direct, control or regulate traffic.

### Sec. 12-3. Riding bicycles on sidewalks; riding bicycles, mopeds or motorcycles in parks and recreation areas.

(a) It is unlawful for any person to operate a bicycle upon any sidewalk or pedestrian walkway in the area bounded by the centerline of the following streets: Elmwood Avenue on the north, Sumter Street on the east, Gervais Street on the south, and Assembly Street on the west.

(b) No bicycles, mopeds or motorcycles shall be ridden in parks or in recreation areas except in areas specifically designated by signs for such use.
