

ARTICLE V. PEDESTRIANS*

Pedestrians shall be subject to traffic-control signals at intersections as provided in this article and to all traffic signs, signals, markers and regulations applicable to pedestrians.

ARTICLE VI. BICYCLES, MOTORIZED BICYCLES AND PLAY VEHICLES*

Sec. 14-64. Bicycles and motorized bicycles--Operating on street generally.

Every person operating a bicycle or motorized bicycle upon a street shall ride as near to the right side thereof as practicable. Persons riding bicycles or motorized bicycles upon a street shall not ride more than two abreast.

Sec. 14-65. Same--Equipment.

Every bicycle or motorized bicycle when in use at nighttime shall be equipped on the front with a light which emits a white light visible to the front and with a red reflector or lamp on the rear, and every bicycle or motorized bicycle shall also be equipped with a proper brake.

No person operating a bicycle or motorized bicycle shall carry any package, bundle or article which prevents the rider from keeping at least one hand upon the handlebars.

Sec. 14-67. Clinging to vehicles.

No person riding upon any bicycle, motorized bicycle, coaster, roller skates, sled or toy vehicle shall attach the same or himself to any vehicle upon a roadway.
